This year, we have just published five Scripture passages in Mixtec, plus a 2019 calendar with six Scripture portions. They are in both of the varieties of Mixtec that we are learning, so that comes to 12 new publications.

These Scripture portions are a part of the Word becoming flesh for these two people groups. The reality of the Incarnation is made manifest through the Word being made available in the language one best understands - the mother tongue.

Thank you for your part in making the truth of the Incarnation become available to the Mixtecs.

Christmas Eve Offering Destinations

The Missions Committee has designated the Christmas Eve offering for the following: 1/3 for Brookings Backpack Program, 1/3 for Tree of Life Mission in Mission, SD, 1/3 to remain with the Missions Committee for unexpected needs arising early in 2019.

Brookings Backpack Program (BBP) (brookingsbackpackproject.org) offers our community's hungry children sustenance, served with tender care and genuine respect. We feed our children hope, one child at a time. Our mission is to assist children and youth in Brookings, SD, who may not have enough food to eat at home by providing them with easy-to-prepare weekend meals and snacks throughout the year. By aiding to sustain these children, we seek not only to help meet their nutritional needs but also to promote their physical, cognitive, and social development, along with enhancing their overall sense of well being.

In a small county like Brookings, hunger isn't always in plain sight. The suffering of the hungry child, like that of the hungry parent or elder, is all too often hidden and silent, seemingly removed from "the rest of us." Ask volunteers at the Harvest Table, the Brookings Food Pantry, and Feeding Brookings and other area organizations, as well as the teachers and staff in our schools who are fully aware that many of our neighbors are struggling. The hungry child is our child-part of the extended family we call community.

Tree of Life (TOL) (treeofliferelief.org) is a relief organization located in Mission, SD, started by the Dakotas Conference of the UMC. Its roots are in the community and offers Construction Projects, Empowerment Options, and Ministry Goals to the people of the Lakota Nation.

The Tree of Life Ministry is a part of the working hands and feet of God to the Lakota Nation residing on the Rosebud Reservation serving body, mind, and soul. TOL feeds, clothes, shelters, and loves. They demonstrate Christ's love, power, and grace to broken and hurting society. Some may think it is a handout, others feel it is a hand-up, however to God it may look like an answer to prayer. It is a witness of love toward salvation.

Commission On a Way Forward – Study this January

The Commission On a Way Forward is the effort to keep the United Methodist Church from splitting over the issue of homosexuality, especially in regards to ordination of LGBTQ persons and the ability to perform and bless same-sex marriages. The Commission was drawn together after the 2016 General Conference and is presenting options for a Special General Conference February 23-26, 2019. The decisions made at that special General Conference will then be written into procedures/structures for the 2020 General Conference which will then make their way down to the Conference level.

A number of more conservative UM Churches (both U.S. and international) are organizing and have threatened to leave if the option of LGBTQ ordination and same-sex marriage is made available through the United Methodist Church. Despite growing acceptance (especially of younger generations) in the U.S. of homosexuality as a faithful lifestyle, plans of more progressive churches to continue ordination and marriages as acts of civil disobedience create pressure from the other side.

This January, Pastor Wade will lead a study as a part of continuing conversations, addressing: 1) Homosexuality & the Bible; 2) How does a church tradition "make room" for differing interpretations while finding strength for the greater mission?; 3) What happens if the COWF decides to go a way other than what we would want as a church or as individuals? (Are we willing to be "compatibilists" or not? And what would that mean? What would civil disobedience look like? And what are the possible costs?)

Just like any house that's a real "fixer upper," our relationships need restoration.
