Be United Methodist

There has been much speculation in newsprint and on social media about the United Methodist Church splitting. There have been some churches who have reservations about the theology of welcome as practised by the United Methodist Church. For some the welcome has been too limited, while for others the welcome has been too wide. As a result the Conference of the United Methodist Church has provided a way for people to leave the UMC over the issue of the inclusion of the LGBTQ community. This was by way of an application for the congregation to vote on leaving, a process that was supervised by the Superintendent and subject to clear rules of departure. Our own church here in Brookings discussed this at our Charge Conference at the end of 2022, and no member of the meeting showed any interest in leaving the United Methodist Church Conference.

The Dakotas Conference has now completed the process for those churches that wanted to disaffiliate. A number of clergy have also left the United Methodist Church. Approximately 15% of our Conference membership have left the UMC. The fact is that the great majority, a supermajority of our churches, members and clergy will remain.

It is now time to put the division behind us. I pray for God's blessing to go with those who have left. And I encourage us to take responsibility for our own spiritual lives as we move forward into the future that God dreams about for us. Bishop Ken Carter, former president of the Council of Bishops of The United Methodist Church, urges us to get back to our own spiritual work:

“we are called to connect to our purpose.

It is a church that is clear about our dependence on the grace of God through Jesus Christ (cross).

It is a church that is clear about our connection with each other—we are the body of Jesus Christ (relationships).

It is a church that teaches and lives a love for God, a love for our neighbor, a love for our enemies and a love for ourselves (flame).

#BeUMC

Said differently...

We are not a church of works righteousness, laws or trials.

We are not a church of heroic solo leaders, celebrities or lone rangers.

We are not a church that understands holiness to be exclusion, superiority or separation.”

I love being part of this congregation, and commit myself anew to loving all who walk through our doors. Let us continue to be people who practice “*open hearts, open minds and open doors*” for the sake of Jesus.

The United Nations declared 2022-2032 the International Decade of Indigenous Languages, presenting an opportunity to promote and support non-dominant languages by providing language development resources that enable communities to flourish using the languages they value most.

SIL is committed to building a positive context for people to use these languages to further cultivate attitudes and initiatives promoting peace, harmony and reconciliation. We will continue supporting language communities in their goals to expand possibilities, gain equal access to critical resources, engage with the Bible and flourish together.

Today, SIL partners with more than 1,300 communities across the globe to provide cutting-edge research, digital tools, educational resources and other language-related support to stand alongside indigenous communities in their efforts to preserve, revitalize and protect the languages they value most.

I am a part of this world-wide initiative to promote these fragile languages, many of which are endangered. Since 1986 I have been involved in a language development program for a Mixtec language, which includes linguistic research, producing literacy materials, training indigenous writers, and Bible translation.

Community Life Center Happenings

This week has been a busy week at the Community Life Center. We served about 100 guests at the Harvest Table meal on Monday evening. Tuesday evening welcomed about 80 PEO members for a regional meeting. Wednesday was the Healthy Movements exercise class for about 15 attendees that meets three times a week and the Manna in the Middle meal and worship service for about 80 worshipers. On Thursday the United Women of Faith held their yearly luncheon for the women in the FUMC congregation. Then the mission committee used the Community Life Center kitchen to prepare the dressing for the upcoming turkey dinner open to the community. To finish out the evening, the United Methodist Men held their monthly meeting. On Friday the Community Life Center was used by Head Start for about 70 teachers for an area meeting. And to finish the week on Saturday there was an anniversary celebration! All of these activities involve coordination between church staff and the groups using the Community Life Center, the janitorial staff to set up and take down tables and chairs and clean the floors and the bathrooms. It is a community used building.

Other events that the Community Life Center is used for are girl scout and boy scout meetings sleep overs and events, worship band practice, Kiwanis pancake and Lion's spaghetti events, birthday parties, graduation parties, wedding receptions, baby showers, SDSU swing dance parties, Head Start classes for 60 children, and the Harvest Table pantry that is open during the week for about 15 persons each day needing assistance. Even the Community Life Center parking lot is used for the monthly food distribution from the Feeding South Dakota mobile food truck.

Thank you to those with the vision of building the Community Life Center to accommodate all of these events both from First United Methodist Church and the Brookings community.

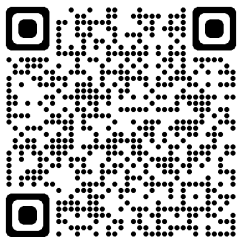

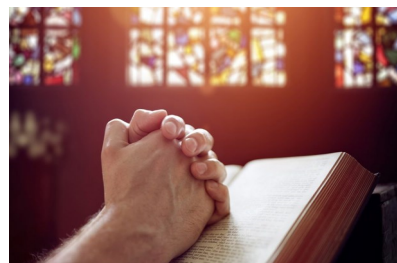
