Susan's Saga

A remarkable bill has been unanimously passed by the South Dakota State Senate: an initiative to recognize the official indigenous language of the state. The proposal is that the language of the Seven Council Fires, also known by treaty as the Great Sioux Nation which is comprised of three dialects including Lakota, Dakota, and Nakota, be designated as the official indigenous language of the state.

If signed into law, South Dakota would be the first state in the lower 48 to identify a native language. The bill would not change anything in terms of what language is used or made available on state forms or elsewhere. Nonetheless, it reaffirms the traditional territory and roots of the state that bears the name of Dakota.

This initiative is very much in tune with the momentum of 2019, which has been declared as the International Year of Indigenous Languages. This observance "aims to raise awareness of the consequences of the endangerment of indigenous languages across the world, with an aim to establish a link between language, development, peace, and reconciliation. Despite their immense value, languages around the world continue to disappear at an alarming rate. With this in mind, the United Nations made this declaration to highlight the important contribution languages make to our world's rich cultural diversity."

In keeping with this movement, we are also endeavoring to document and promote the use of an endangered language in Oaxaca, Mexico. God's message found in the Bible is for each language. Given that, people should be able to read God's message in the language they best understand.

Susan Huggins

Susan Huggins is a daughter of this church serving in full-time ministry as a Bible translator among the Mixtec people of Oaxaca, Mexico. Susan's sending agency, Wycliffe Bible Translators, is a non-denominational organization; she raises her own funds to support this ministry.

90th Birthday Celebration



Faith Community Nurse Note: March is National Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month

What is colorectal cancer? Colorectal cancer is a cancer that starts in the rectum or colon. Both of these organs are in the lower portion of your digestive system. The colon is also known as the large intestine. The rectum is at the end of the colon.

The American Cancer Society estimates 1 in 22 men and 1 in 24 women will develop colorectal cancer during their lifetime.

Prevention: Certain risk factors for colon cancer, such as family history and age, aren't preventable. However, lifestyle factors that may contribute to colorectal cancer are preventable, and may help reduce your overall risk of developing this disease.

You can take steps now to reduce your risk by:

- decreasing the amount of red meat you eat
- avoiding processed meats, such as hot dogs and deli meats
- eating more plant-based foods
- decreasing dietary fat in your diet
- exercising daily
- losing weight, if your doctor recommends it
- quitting smoking
- reducing alcohol consumption
- decreasing stress
- controlling preexisting diabetes

Another preventive measure is to make sure you get a colonoscopy after the age of 50, even if you don't have risk factors for colon cancer. The earlier the cancer is detected, the better the outcome.
