Dear Brookings First Family,

As many of you know, a few weeks ago I communicated with the church the news that I will be relocating to Sioux Falls at the end of June this year. The discernment process that leads up to decisions like this is long and difficult—it has involved much

prayer and conversations with those dear to me. I have been so blessed to serve as your Associate Pastor, even as I make the decision that ultimately is best for my family.

Times of transition are naturally anxiety-producing. The Apostle Paul knew this even as he penned the above words to a new and growing Philippian church. An itinerant preacher himself, Paul was constantly on the move, and that meant that he regularly said goodbye to congregations he had shepherded, then wrote to them from a distance later. And so, it was natural that this pastor would remind the Philippians at the beginning of this pastoral letter of the true source of their hope, confidence and trust-God. It is God who begins the work, God who continues it, and God who brings it to completion.

From the General Conference of the United Methodist Church

A commission for the UMC General Conference decided to postpone the General Conference again due to travel constraints for delegates in other countries: "The visa issue is a reality that is simply outside our control as we seek to achieve a reasonable threshold of delegate presence and participation," Kim Simpson, chairperson of the commission for the General Conference, said in an official statement. "Ultimately our decision reflects the hope that 2024 will afford greater opportunity for global travel and a higher degree of protection for the health and safety of delegates and attendees."

In the light of this postponement, a group of members who are unhappy with the presence of LGBTQ members and clergy in the UMC have decided to leave the UMC. On May 1 they launched a new church called The Global Methodist Church. This is a more conservative Methodist denomination that invites local congregations to join a new global movement. The Brookings First United Methodist Church does not plan to leave the United Methodist Church. We will adhere to the traditional Methodist position of an open table at Holy Communion. We will continue to be a place where "Open Minds, Open Hearts, and Open Doors" means that all are welcome. If you have any questions, please feel free to speak to Pastor Pete.

Susan's Saga

Bible translation in the digital age has a different look. In addition to books and hard copies of the Bible, computers allow a variety of commentaries, exegetical helps, and versions of the Bible in Spanish and English to be visible on the screen. A big advantage is that the program can be set so that the verses are synchronized, enabling all of these resources to move along together as we advance through a passage. The interlinear Greek text is on one of the columns on the screen, allowing insight into the original language.


The Mixtec translation is also on the display. The person who is the scribe revises the translation, then sends the adjustments. The rest can receive the latest development on their own device at their respective locations and see how the current revision reads. The team talks about suggestions via WhatsApp on the cell phone.

We are thankful that the translation can continue virtually, even though the members of the team are in different locations.

Thank you for your part in this process of making God's Word available to this group of people in their heart language.
